RECREATION BOARD – MEETING MINUTES
NOVEMBER 18, 2025 – 7:00 P.M.

The Borough of Wyomissing Recreation Board held their regular meeting in the Borough of Wyomissing Council Chambers on the above date and time. Rick Weinoffer called the meeting to order with the following persons present: Board members Jessica Christman, Michael Sharer, Pamela Wetzell, Kristen Gajewski, Jess Leinbach, and Sally Donato; Recreation Director Randy McKinley, Borough Manager & Economic Development Coordinator Michele Bare, and Borough Secretary Melissa Miller. The following persons were absent: Board members Karim Davidson and Liz Toigo.

Public Comment:

No public comment was provided.

Approval of Meeting Minutes:

A motion was made by Mike Sharer and seconded by Jess Leinbach to approve the October 2025 meeting minutes, all in favor.

Approval of Financial Report:

Rich Weinoffer shared with the Board, that the Borough as a whole will be taking on a deficit moving into 2026. Despite some of the subcommittees not wanting to raise Recreation fees, the Finance and Administration committee and Council felt that increases would help further offset programming costs. All Recreation fees were increased, but specifically pointed out that Playground increased 15% and the pool by 7.5%. He noted that it will be important moving forward that if some events are not doing as well as others, it will need to be assessed to potentially not have that event again. As well, it will be important to assess costs and potentially make programs smaller. He explained that no cuts for programming were imposed, but shared that the Recreation budget will not increase for 2026.

A motion was made by Kristen Gajewski, seconded by Sally Donato to approve the October 2025 financial report, all in favor.

Committee Reports:

Sally Donato thanked all who participated with the Spooky Hollow event. The event had a great turnout with approximately 3,000 to 4,000 people. She noted that the event setup was nicely spread out so people were not overcrowded, and was elated at how the haunted house turned out. She pointed out that there were things that could be better, but will be discussed by the subcommittee.

Due to Liz Toigo's absence, Randy shared that no meeting was scheduled, and expressed great concern of the student advisory committee falling apart. He and Liz are going to regroup after the holidays to find ways to make the committee more desirable and effective.

Kristen shared that new members were appointed to the Playground subcommittee, and the goal is to focus on the parent handbook, registration, and disclaimers. There was discussion that the price increase may impact enrollment, and Erin and Nikki were on board with working with a smaller budget to help avoid further price increases.

There was still much concern about children under the age of five participating in last year's Playground program. The subcommittee felt that greater checks and balances are necessary moving forward, suggesting that the Borough consider checking grade level versus age, with some type of document upload. They also felt that a process is needed after a parent or guardian would sign a waiver form, or for a parent or guardian enrolling their child who is too young. Randy reminded the committee that as per the Department of Human Services, the Borough is already going above and beyond to have parents complete the waiver form. The contact at DHS indicated that if a waiver form is signed and falsified by a parent or guardian, the liability shifts from the Borough to signor. It was determined at the subcommittee meeting that there were a few known children who were under the age limit, participating in the program where parents knowingly signed off, and staff received push back for knowing the children did not meet the age requirement.

A question arose as to if the younger aged children detracted from the quality of programming, and there slightly was, however the subcommittee felt that last year's waiver was out of alignment with other safety measures within the program, and noted that the program is not staffed for children younger than five years old. The Board briefly spoke about revising the disclosure to post on MyRec before the 2026 enrollment. It was noted that Erin and Nikki will help monitor the registration process to aid in determining youth who may not be eligible for the Tot-Lot program. This would assist with identifying and removing students before the program begins. Next steps for handling someone who is not of grade level, will be developed by the Playground Facilitator and Director, of which will then be discussed at a subcommittee meeting.

Rick shared that Lighting of the Greens is upcoming in December, of which the Select High School Chorus will perform at the event, and Randy shared that vendor participation had reached 10 and has been closed. There was brief discussion about reopening vendor registration and allowing more vendors along the pond. Sally has been monitoring volunteer registration, noting that spaces are almost full, in part with help by a school teacher who was able to gather volunteers. Randy mentioned that the Girl Scouts will not be doing the s'mores station this year, but will participate with their other activities. The Boy Scouts will again do the fire pit and cider, and potentially the luminaries if they have enough help. If not, there will be volunteers on hand to assist. It was reiterated that help will be needed for cleanup. Kristen mentioned that she is doing the chili cook-off again, will chili available for sale. Rick lastly mentioned that he is working on some decorations for the event.

Parks & Recreation Director's Report:

Under his director's report, Randy shared that the Fall Walk series wrapped up, with the QR code signs available until November 24, 2025 in the Parklands. The Pumpkin People event went very well, with 17 groups/businesses participating, with positive comments received. He shared that house Boo'ing took place with a home on Squire Court winning.

Randy explained that the Holiday Lights Fun Run/Walk series is upcoming on December 3, 10, and 17, 2025. Fleet Feet will again spearhead the event, and he will see if the Hills Social

Committee would be interested in providing cider again.

Relative to field rentals, he shared that Rugby and Kickball have ended, but the Berks Ultimate Disc Association (BUDA) are renting the Quarry field for \$50 per hour.

Randy noted that the Berkshire Heights playground revitalization is coming along, with mulch being blown in, ADA parking access being prepared, and an anticipated opening in the next few weeks. He shared that the vendor policy was reviewed and revised, with a vendor fee added to the 2026 fee schedule, and the Recreation Guide is in progress. There was concern that the Twilight fee times are not accurate, so Randy indicated he would double check.

Old Business:

The fee schedule was discussed earlier in the meeting during the financial review.

New Business:

Randy briefly explained that currently, the baseball and soccer leagues are not paying the Borough to rent the fields. He pointed out that \$18,000 is budgeted for field maintenance between the two. Again, as the Borough is moving into a year with a budget deficit, it is important to generate some revenues to offset costs. He will be reaching out to Spring Township to determine their field usage fees for the clubs and organizations, and will be making the soccer and baseball agreements month to month until fees are determined and new contract drawn up. The Board was in favor of looking at the implementation of field usage fees. They were also not opposed to the sports groups coming to a Board meeting to provide an update. Once new contracts are developed, the Solicitor will review and then will go to the Board for approval and to move to Council.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:53 p.m. The next regularly scheduled meeting of the Recreation Board will be held on Tuesday, January 20, 2026 at 7:00 p.m.
